The diversity in India is unique. Our Country presents endless varieties of different tradition and cultural patterns. It is the land of many languages it is only in India people professes all the major religions of the world



The village of Rui is a veritable microcosm of the nation of India itself. The villagers of Rui are predominantly Hindus with sizeable Muslim and Buddhist minorities, and they all have been happily coexisting for a very long time. Roughly 275 years ago the marauding armies of the Nizam saw fit to destroy the ancient Sriram temple located within the village and as recently as the 1940's, during the Razakar agitation, Hindu mobs destroyed the Jumma Masjid and Khwaja Zainuddin Dargah situated within the village limits. Time and the locals themselves, proved to be the ablest healers in this communal discord.

Then later a miracle happened, with the initiative from Hon. Dr. V. D. Karad, Founder & Chairmen, MIT MAEER organization, the Hindus and Muslims came together to rebuilt the destroyed mosque and temple, and through that act, celebrate diversity and the 'Bharatiya' way to living and letting live!

Taking cue from this occasion, Prof. Dr. Vishwanath Karad ensured the construction of the "Vishwadharmi Shriram-Rahim Manavta Setu' to celebrate bridging the divide between Hindus and Muslims. 


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

# 1. Matoshri Old Age Home, Latur (2nd February 2020)



## 2. Camp at Happy Indian Village (Centre for people suffering from AIDS)

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, with the NSS unit of MIDSR Dental College, Latur, organised and conducted an oral health awareness camp for the children residing at HIV Village, Hasegao, Latur, on February 3. The department conducted an awareness programme where health talks were delivered on common oral health problems and regular healthy oral hygiene habits. The special guidance was provided to the staff working at the centre about the oral manifestations of HIV and how to overcome them. The institute distributed toothpaste and toothbrushes to the participants, and the tooth brushing programme was also conducted.

# SWADHAR Matimand Mulinche Balgrah, Dist. Osmanabad (SWADHAR Home for Special Girls)

The Public Health Dentistry Department conducted an oral health awareness, screening, and treatment camp for the mentally retarded girls residing at Swadhar Matimand Mulinche Balgruh, Dist. Osmanabad, on March 30<sup>th.</sup> The camp was organised in order to sensitise the students regarding their social responsibilities towards the weaker sections of society. The camp was conducted in cooperation with the Tuljai Trust of Pangaon. In the camp, oral health awareness, demonstrations about the brushing technique, a tooth brushing programme, oral health screening, and also non-invasive treatment procedures were carried out, along with the distribution of free medicines, toothpastes, and toothbrushes. The institute also provided free treatment to the girls referred from the centre to the institute.





6 AWARENESS RALLY: On the occasion of World Oral Health Day, we organised a campaign to raise awareness of oral health issues and the importance of oral hygiene. The day holds significance to reflect the importance of oral hygiene and care. A baby must have 20 teeth, and senior citizens must have 20 teeth at the end of their lives. A healthy adult should have 32 healthy teeth. rally and a Dental Diagnosis and Awareness Camp were organised. The rally was conducted using IEC materials and posters with the aim to create awareness of the benefits of a healthy mouth and to promote worldwide awareness of the issues surrounding oral health and the importance of oral hygiene.

With the motto of encouraging as many people as possible to look after their mouths and protect their quality of life. An unhealthy mouth not only impacts general health but also has a severe impact on people's emotional, social, mental, and overall physical well-being. It highlights the associations between oral diseases and non communicable diseases (like diabetes, hypertension, respiratory disease, and some cancers), raises awareness of common risk factors, and promotes good oral hygiene habits.

We also conducted a dental camp in the school, where 263 children were checked for dental cavities and other dental problems by students and staff, and we also spoke to the children about brushing their teeth twice a day, avoiding too much sugar, and practising other good habits for proper oral hygiene. A power point presentation was prepared for children's and school teachers to provide information about the importance of oral health and explain in detail the root cause of dental and oral health problems, methods of preventing the diseases, and different treatment facilities available.

#### 8.AAROGYA SURAKSHA YOJNA (HEALTH CARDS)

The concept of starting Arogya Suraksha Yojna(Health Protection Scheme) which is also one of the best practices of our Institute was the philosophical idea of our Honurable. Executive Director Mr. RameshappaKarad sir, He believed that he has moral obligations towards the society in which he was raised and should do something for the unprivileged people of the Community. The moto behind starting the scheme was to ensure the wellness & complete health including the oral health of the entire families residing in rural areas of Latur District as Oral health: A window to your overall health.

Under the Aarogya Suraksha Yojna around 50,000 families were adopted by the institute to look after the wellness and complete health of the family. The institute covered almost 194 villages from the districts and the health cards were distributed to the families who are economical weaker, who resides mainly in the rural areas/slum areas. Such a large no. of adoption was itself is bigger challenge to the institution and it has to deal with almost thousands of people's wellbeing The institute also purchased two dedicated buses for the daily transportation of the patients. The huge no. of adoption, transportation facilities and the daily follow ups helped in the rise of OPD due to the same the institute witnessed the overall increase in the OPD by average 100 patients daily. The institute took it as a challenge with the available resources and utilized the manpower to treat the increased no. of OPD.

### Facilities provided in Health Cards

This practice benefited the students directly in terms of the patient exposure they received; they benefited from the additional patient work and also got exposure to various cases. It also helped in the overall development of the clinical and communication skills of the students, and it also helped the economically weaker sections of the community.

The patients got the privilege to avail themselves of the oral health procedures as there is no developed government facility available for the oral health care of the community in this region. It also helped in promoting the oral health of the patients and in screening for diseases in their early stages, which in turn helped provide preventive care to the patients.

CULTURAL FESTIVALS: Celebrating festivals in college campuses brings students together and also provides an opportunity the students to learn more about each other culture. Celebrating cultural or religious festivals in academic institutions is a learning experience – students get to learn about the festival, the reason for the celebration and its significance which also enhances respect to all religion


